THE SPECIES CHAMPION COMPETITION

The Species Champion Competition requires anglers to catch a variety of species throughout the year.

The competition is run in 2 divisions: Deep Sea and Beach, Rock and Estuary.

Anglers are required to catch a maximum of 20 species which include the 12 species on the yearly board as well as another eligible species and 7 other nominated species in the relevant section. (See species list in recording sheets)

Anglers are responsible for maintaining their own capture records. You are required to keep the weigh in receipts for the best of each species. The record sheet and receipts are to be submitted to the weighmaster at the last comp of the year.

The winner will be the angler who has caught the most species.

Where several anglers have caught the same number of species, each fish will be allocated points compared to the weight of that species on the Yearly Board.

For example, if you have a 1kg flathead and the board fish is 2kg, your fish is worth half the possible points (100). So your fish counts as 50 points. This would be applied to each of your fish. If you have the best fish on the Yearly Board, your fish is worth 100 points.

Fish may be caught anywhere in NSW and ACT by lawful means.
